‘Homestation’ building repair works

KEPCO Bylong Australia (KEPCO) is continuing maintenance work on the historic c1848 ‘Homestation’ building (also known as Lee Homestead) situated on the property ‘Bylong Park’, which is owned by KEPCO Australia.

KEPCO acknowledges the significance of the Homestation building in the history of the development of the local area, and local residents’ interest regarding its ongoing maintenance.

KEPCO has developed plans to maintain Homestation and has liaised with local authorities regarding its repair and upkeep. The company has engaged a qualified stonemason to undertake repair works, which commenced early 2015 and are being completed in accordance with best conservation management practices.



As part of ongoing monitoring of the building, KEPCO has been advised by heritage specialists that the chimney shaft is at risk of collapse. To facilitate repair works and reinforce the structural integrity of the building, the chimney shaft will need to be dismantled and re-erected once stability issues have been appropriately addressed.
