We have made positive progress in the recovery from the pandemic but the continuing need to keep the economy moving and to create local jobs has been a common theme during our engagement with local community and key stakeholders. Project Progress

Late last year, the NSW Land and Environment Court (LEC) dismissed KEPCO's appeal in relation to the refusal of Bylong Coal Project. KEPCO has now filed a 'notice of appeal' with the NSW Court of Appeal, challenging the LEC's decision. At this stage, KEPCO expects the matter to be heard by the Court of Appeal during the third quarter of this year with a judgment by the end of the year.

Farming Operations

KEPCO has recently undertaken a review of its farming operations and is considering changes in the way it manages its properties, including the leasing of its land. We will provide updates if there are any changes. KEPCO will ensure sustainable agricultural production is maintained on its properties.

Site Activities

There are currently no site exploration activities in progress.
